 - o Shouldn't be taking care of the road if we are not receiving their taxes.
- Councilmember Mitton
 - Maintaining the roads.
 - East of the road are Ponderay residents and Westside are not.
 - Councilmember Thompson
 - The City will have to continue maintenance of road.
- Mayor Geiger
 - o Look into agreement with property owners and IHD for road maintenance.
 - Look into Property Taxes.
 - Bonner County vs Ponderay.
 - Options :
 - City Attorney Marshall
 - Can table and revisit at a date in the future.
