I write in support of the City of Ponderay's <u>Pend d 'Oreille Bay Trail (POBT) BUILD Grant Application.</u> Ponderay has launched an effort to complete a planning grant in the amount of \$566,000 to pay for the design and engineering pre-work for a railroad undercrossing to access Lake Pend Oreille in Ponderay, Idaho. This grant will also cover the cost of NEPA work and preliminary design work for the highway approach leading to the undercrossing.

A formal feasibility study was completed 3-2017 paid for by the Idaho Department of Environmental Quality and Friends of the POBT non-profit 501c (3). An underpass is needed to provide a safe alternative to local residences illegally crossing BNSF mainline tracks - with up to 34 trains a day - to reach the beach and nature trail in order to avoid a 3.3 mile drive to the Sandpoint Beach entrance. BNSF is aware of the issue and looking for solutions to avoid loss of life.

Nearly a third of Ponderay, Idaho's residents rely on food stamps. This project could be a major factor in increased business and employment opportunities as visitors to the beach and trailhead would provide. The amount of the grant request is \$566,000.

I support the City of Ponderay Idaho's BUILD application and efforts to provide design and engineering cost for this must needed project. I urge the U.S. Department of Transportation to give the application all due consideration.

I write in support of the city of Ponderay's "Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development" (BUILD) grant application. The city of Ponderay, Idaho, would use the BUILD grant to fund the planning phase of a pedestrian underpass beneath a busy double track rail line. The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (IDEQ) Brownfields Program was awarded a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Coalition Assessment Cooperative Agreement in the amount of \$650,000 in 2009 for the Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail Brownfields (POBT) Assessment Coalition. Coalition partners included IDEQ, and the City of Ponderay, the City of Sandpoint, the City of Kootenai, and Bonner County. Environmental assessments were undertaken on nineteen properties and identified the need for cleanup on one property: former Panhandle Smelting and Refining Company. IDEQ is currently developing options and costs for cleanup at PSRC with the City of Ponderay.

The POBT curves along the shoreline of Lake Pend Oreille, the largest natural lake in Idaho and one of the largest inland lakes in North America. Situated within a rare undeveloped corridor on the lake's northern waterfront in Bonner County, the trail provides a peaceful setting for an easy close-to-town walk or bike with striking views of the lake and surrounding mountains. While the current trail stretches over 1.5 miles, the final project is envisioned as a 2.0 mile trail with 20-acre municipal park system connecting three shoreline communities - Sandpoint, Ponderay and Kootenai. The POBT will provide a pedestrian and bicycle-friendly route for children and adults to travel through these communities while greatly enhancing public access to the lake's northern shore.

The Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail is a valued community asset, but can now only be accessed from Sandpoint. An underpass in Ponderay will open up this trail to the larger community. This BUILD Planning Grant will advance an important community project: the construction of a railroad pedestrian underpass that will connect Ponderay and Kootenai to Lake Pend Oreille and the POBT shoreline trail that leads to downtown Sandpoint and Sandpoint City Beach.



By building and undercrossing this would greatly alleviate a safety issue of people crossing active railroad tracks.

In 2016 Bonner County EMS was able to purchase an off-road ambulance specifically to access railroad tracks and trails that a regular sized ambulance cannot. This ambulance was purchased through a generous donation by BNSF. Bonner County EMS has recognized for quite some time that the rail traffic through our area can present unique hazards to the public. By the purchasing of this ambulance we can better access the Pend Oreille Bay Trail, however, our access points are very limited. Not only will this undercrossing provide a safer route for the public, it will also provide an additional access point for all emergency responders.

I applaud you and the City of Ponderay's efforts in making access to the trail a much safer environment for all concerned.

On behalf of the Friends of the Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail, I'd like to express our wholehearted support for the city's application for a federal BUILD Planning Grant to fund the Lakeshore Connection Project, which would provide much-needed access to the lakeshore for your city and the community of Kootenai.

The Friends of the Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail grew out of a committee established by former Sandpoint Mayor Ray Miller in 2005 to determine how to bring the shoreline trail into public hands. With the help of the National Park Service and public involvement, we created a conceptual plan for the Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail. We then reorganized as the Friends of the Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail, 501C3 organization, in order to serve as a private partner to the cities of Sandpoint, Ponderay and Kootenai in achieving the goal of connecting these communities with a shoreline trail.

In 2014, we finalized a successful campaign to open the 1.4-mile trail to the public by raising funds to support the cities' acquisition of private waterfront. However, the trail still does not truly connect these three communities. The bulk of this shoreline trail is within the city limits of Ponderay, but the only legal and safe access is through Sandpoint. While the trail serves about 200 people per day in fair weather, these people mostly use it as an out-and-back recreation, exercise opportunity. The few exceptions involve individuals who are trespassing across the double set of railroad tracks in Ponderay to get to the trail and the lake. A connection to Ponderay would allow many more people to benefit from this trail.

In 2014 and 2015, the Friends worked with the cities and a design and engineering firm to produce a Master Trail and Interpretive Plan for the trail. During the planning process, we gathered stakeholder and public input on potential improvements through meetings, events and a survey. The Ponderay underpass emerged as a top priority from this public input. This connection is clearly needed for a number of reasons, chief among them safety for those determined to get to the lake, despite the barrier of the railroad tracks. The people of Ponderay have an incredible outdoor amenity at their doorstep, but the railroad tracks prevent this impoverished community from enjoying the benefits of the region's greatest natural asset.

We are convinced that this underpass will improve the health and quality of life for the residents of Ponderay – and neighboring Kootenai. Easy, safe access to a natural shoreline trail will be an incentive for residents to get outside and walk, bike or swim along the lakeshore. This access will be a draw for businesses and visitors to Ponderay, helping to boost the local economy. Access to the trail will give an alternative commuting route between Ponderay and Sandpoint. The Pend d'Oreille Bay Trail planning has progressed alongside assessments and plans for the eventual cleanup of the Brownfields site at Black Rock, which currently has unsafe levels of lead and arsenic on-site and can never be used by the property owner, or the public, until it is cleaned up. The underpass, in short, is closely tied to the cleanup of a human health and environmental hazards along the shoreline, as well as commercial, civic and residential development within walking distance of the lakeshore.

The planning and preparation for this project has been deliberate and many years in the making. We understand that the biggest challenges facing Ponderay in this effort have been financial. A BUILD planning grant will advance this underpass proposal to project readiness and bring within reach a critical piece of community infrastructure and greatly improve connectivity in Bonner County. We are honored to be a partner in this effort.
